Australia's economy is well-placed to benefit from strong demand for critical minerals with the global appetite expected to rise by 350% by 2040, official forecasts showed on Wednesday, as many big economies rush to hit net zero emission targets by 2050.

Australia supplies around half of the world's lithium and has vast reserves of the nickel, zinc and bauxite required for the production of clean energy technology in electric vehicles and batteries. It has the potential for more undiscovered minerals, with around 80% of the land mass largely underexplored...

On the back of a strong scoping study last year, Perthbased company Toro Energy has commissioned a pilot processing plant design and added vanadium to its Wiluna uranium project in Western Australia's Goldfields region. The study into a standalone uranium-vanadium mining and processing operation at its Lake Maitland deposit, about 105km south-east of Wiluna and within the company's broader Wiluna project, holds a pre-tax net present value of \$610 million at an eight per cent discount rate and a total capital cost of \$270 million...



Encouraging metallurgy results for vanadium pentoxide and high-purity alumina (HPA) concentrates – from mineralised seams not included in Critical Minerals' current mineral resource estimate – will turbobost outcomes for the company's upcoming scoping study into its flagship Lindfield project in north-west Queensland.

Management says its vanadium metallurgical results bode well for potential further improvement on optimisation of grade and recovery, with upperseam material returning a beneficiated product of 1.5 percent vanadium pentoxide on the fourth test. It also achieved an 85 percent vanadium extraction on the first leach test...
